

# Rolling Green Town Board Minutes

## May 12, 2014

Members present – Dan, Brian, Daniel, David, Todd.

Beginning Balance - \$66,494.45 - Checking \$5325.08, Savings \$61,169.37

Deposit this month – None

Paid this month - \$6579.85

Ending Balance - \$59,914.60 - Checking \$745.23, Savings \$59,169.37

The representatives of the 5 entities involved in the fire agreement with Welcome met on May 8, 2014 and came to an agreement signed by all parties. Brian moved, seconded by David, to approve a resolution approving the agreement. Motion carried. Copy included.

The 4 townships are planning to set up a fund to use for fire equipment. Attorney Jim Wilson has been sent a request to draw up the required documents in time for the June meetings. Funds would be held at Welcome State Bank. All disbursements would need to be approved by all 4 townships. Other guidelines have also been sent to him. The first deposit of \$2000 from each township would be made at the July meetings.

Dan will check with Welcome, after the fire agreement is signed, about paying off the remaining balance of the fire truck in June.

Bettin's have been given a \$35,000 budget to use for the first round of gravel. It appears the gravel from Cohr's is again of a good quality. Cohr's may be used for additional gravel needs to check out their gravel quality before next year.

Wannarka Excavating still owes 2 loads of crushed concrete. They may be used on 170<sup>th</sup> Ave just south of old 16.

The seals on the drive wheels of the grader need replacing. The cost should be around \$4000.

Rosburg is planning to do the culvert replacements on 150<sup>th</sup> Ave and the removal of the old cattle crossing on Pierce Lake Road in the near future.

The road agreements recently approved by Manyaska Township were discussed. Further discussion will take place at next month's meeting.

Dan will check with his son-in-law about setting up a web site for Rolling Green Township. Included would be road policies, Right-of-way information, ditch cleanup requirements, etc.

The railroad crossing on the township roads have been rebuilt by the railroad. They are in much better shape than they were.

Some of the ditches are getting clogged with dirt and need cleaning out. Pierce Lake Road south of the lake needs major work. Todd will look at what needs doing and get bids where necessary.

Election training is scheduled for the evenings of July 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> and the afternoon of the 16<sup>th</sup>. Dan will try to get reservations for the 8<sup>th</sup>.

Should the supervisors get LBAE training so the township can continue handling this, or should we let the County handle questions about assessments? It was decided to keep this in house, if possible. Dan will check on when training will be held.
